The Frieze Impact Prize is for an applicant's existing work, or works that are in progress but can be completed before *February 1st*, 2025.

Please provide the following information.

- 2. Social Media (Facebook, Instagram, X, Youtube, Vimeo, TikTok, etc.): We encourage applicants, especially those who don't provide websites, to share their social media links and other links that exemplify your work or catalog. This can include blogs, archival sites, and more.

SHORT ESSAY QUESTIONS

On our Submittable form, you will be asked to answer these questions in 150 words or less.

Tips

- We encourage applicants to check for spelling and grammar by preparing their answers on a separate document before submitting the text into the form.
- All panelists will be reviewing these answers to determine if applicants are eligible for the Right of Return Fellowship and the Frieze Impact Prize. Where you can be specific about organizations, communities, and events—please do!
- If you need clarity on a specific question, you can email <u>outreach@thecenter.art</u> for more info. Responses may take 24-48 hours, so please plan accordingly.
- 1) Briefly describe your experience with the criminal legal system.
- 2) What criminal legal reform issue areas do you address in your work? In what ways does your choice of specific form, technique, material, medium, etc. convey these ideas if any?
- 3) How, if at all, does your work counter the way the criminal legal system is commonly understood? How, if at all, does it help viewers have a deeper understanding of the families and communities impacted by the system?
- 4) Describe the specific project you are requesting support for, including the issue areas you plan to address and your artistic approach. (*Be sure to include the Who?What? Why? Where? When? How?*)
- 5) Is there a specific criminal justice organization or advocate(s) you hope to collaborate with? Explain how your project might be integrated in a partner organization or advocate's campaign or strategy. How will you coordinate and collaborate with your partner(s)?
- 6) Who is your intended audience and what does the successful completion of your project look like? How will it reach your audience?



ARTIST SAMPLES SUBMISSION

Please provide examples of your work. We know it can be hard to narrow down but please remember that we can use your website or social media as a reference should we need to seek additional examples.

VISUAL ART

- Upload images of the work you would like the jury to consider here. Submit at least five (5) and up to fifteen (15) individual images maximum of .jpeg or .png files to demonstrate scale, detail, angles or other elements of your pieces.
- Please specify title, medium, date and dimensions of each of the works.
- Please specify where your work is currently located.
- If the works you would like the jury to consider are in video form, please provide a viewing link here.
- Documentation of both past and recent bodies of work strongly encouraged for consideration for the Frieze Impact Prize.

FILM

- Submit three (3) video or audio samples of your work, no longer than five (5) minutes each for a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes total for all samples.
- Submissions should be uploaded as either video (.wav) or video links (YouTube, Vimeo, etc.).
- If you have provided a viewing link which is password protected, please share the password here.
- For experimental film, documentation of both past and recent bodies of work strongly encouraged for consideration for the Frieze Impact Prize.

CREATIVE WRITING

- Creative writers must submit three (3) prose samples maximum of their work, submitted as three (3) separate .PDF documents; or five (5) to ten (10) pages of poetry submitted as one document uploaded as a single .PDF document.
- You can submit up to **two (2) prose samples and one (1) poetry sample** for writers working in multiple genres.
- If including work that features images or video, please upload the images and links as a single page .pdf.
- Each prose sample should be **no more than 3,000 words**. If included as an excerpt, please notate that under the title of the submission.
- Documents MUST be in PDF format, unsecured (not password-protected), and all pages should be A4 or Letter-Size (8.5" x 11") and in portrait orientation. Use only standard fonts (e.g., Arial, Times New Roman, Helvetica, Georgia, etc.). Font size should be 12-



point. Line spacing and margin size for all documents are your choice. Please make sure that all scanned PDFs are in portrait orientation.

- Published *and* unpublished work will be accepted.
- There is no requirement to be published by the time of the application.

MUSIC, SPOKEN WORD, PODCAST, PERFORMANCE

- Musicians and spoken-word poets must submit three (3) video or audio samples of their work, no longer than five (5) minutes each for a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes total for all samples.
- Submissions should be uploaded as either video (.wav), unsecured (not password-protected) video links (YouTube, Vimeo, etc.), or audio (.wav), or unsecured (not password-protected) audio streaming links (Bandcamp, Soundcloud, Spotify, Apple Music, etc.).

MULTIDISCIPLINARY SAMPLES

Applicants who would like to provide samples may submit one of the following combinations:

- Five (5) to ten (10) individual images maximum. (See Visual Art instructions.)
- One (1) writing sample. (See Creative Writing instructions.)
- One (1) video or music sample. (See Film or Music/Spoken Word/Podccast/Performance instructions.)

Or

- Two (2) writing samples. (See Creative Writing instructions.)
- One (1) video or music sample. (See Film or Music/Spoken Word/Podccast/Performance instructions.)

OPTIONAL

Resume/CV: Resume/CV is optional for the 2025 Right of Return Fellowship, but both materials are highly recommended for consideration for the Frieze Impact Prize. Please provide a 1–3-page resume that outlines your previous publications, exhibitions, programs, viewings, teaching, and organizing events. Please view our sample below.
